




KS1-KS3 Data KS4 and KS5 Examination Data Summer Exam Series



Key Stage 1 / 2 Teacher Assessment Data



Data above shows that across both KS1 and KS2 students are on target or have exceeded their target grade for the end of year. Only year 6 students (20%) are below where they were predicted and this was accounted for by a higher level of absence and therefore limited access to the curriculum.




As an indicator of progress made the primary data above shows in year progress from Baseline at the start of the year to the CWAG. 50% of subject areas ALL students had made significant progress. ICT and Humanities had made the least progress in year however, in the case of ICT baseline levels were set quite high meaning that progress from these points was more difficult.

Area for development

- Work with staff to develop humanities curriculum and assessment frameworks Increasing monitoring of progress.
- Training needs on standardisation and moderation of baseline assessments and target grading


A pleasing set of results for KS5 students – There has been an increased emphasis on PfA with vocational / skills based courses becoming more appropriate for our cohort of learners.


What our data tells us:

When you compare groups of students e.g PP / Male / Female / LAC etc there are no statistically significant trends across the school however our data does allow us to look at subject areas / pathways to focus on as well as focus on individual student progress.


Pathway leads and learning leads complete a data review and create action points based on data collated at each data entry point. Individual student data can also be applied to a class intervention log and monitoring through formative assessment by class staff.


KS1/2 Cohorts

This academic year we have also developed our assessment system to allow us to quickly analyse data in MAPP which is the assessment system used for out PMLD and SLD learners. The assessment allows us to identify strands linked to specific behaviours on the students PLGs that students need to develop (Example below)


Again this approach does not show statistically significant trends but it does show a bespoke learning journey for individual students



Year 11 / 12 Leavers Destinations


Key Stage 4 Destinations

- 20 Learners in year 11
- Following a pleasing set of results for our students 100% of students went on to continue their education.
- Majority of students have remained on site at Wilson Stuart 6th form = (80%)
- 10% (2) of students have gone on to mainstream college / external providers (Solihull College)



Key Stage 5 Leavers – Destinations

- 19 Leavers in total at KS5 (Year 14)
- 89% of students have gone onto continue their studies.
- Majority (68%) continuing at the Hive.
- 21% have gone onto external providers (QAC / Sutton College)
- Remaining 11% of students (2) have left education Cease of EHCP
